According to the rules defined by the 5 Member States of European Territorial Cooperation Programme Atlantic Area, in 2010 France presides over committee and monitoring bodies meetings.

I therefore take this opportunity to highlight the remarkable level of cooperation shown by all Programme participants. Whether they be State representatives, management, audit and certification authorities, or Regions, they all serve the interests of the Atlantic Area as a whole.

It is this sense of cooperation which has allowed the selection and subsequent financing of some 48 projects all of which are of great interest and which fulfil the priorities and objectives of the Programme as defined by the Member States and the European Commission. In addition, these projects have enabled the Programme to achieve a high level of ERDF allocation, with grants awarded totalling 74% of available funds.

There still remains an underusage of the Programme's priority 3 funds, "Improve accessibil-

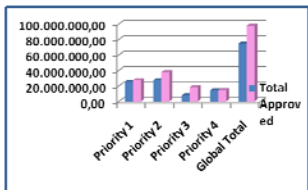
ity and internal links". This is because after the two calls for proposals, launched in 2008 and 2009, applications under this priority were lower than expected.

An analysis is to be undertaken and the subsequent actions that we take, will create greater opportunities to reach more potential beneficiaries in 2010. At the same time we will ensure a high level of quality control over projects and their management, which is more important than ever in light of the economic, social and environmental crisis that the European Union is currently experiencing.

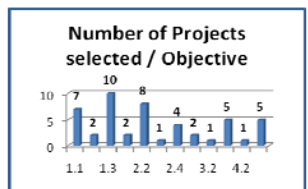

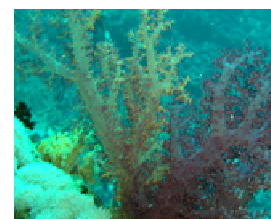

Cruise Atlantic Europe has been present at Miami Cruise Shipping by its seven member ports on the Atlantic front: Lisbon, Porto, A Coruña, Bilbao, Brittany Ports (St. Malo and Brest), Cork and Dover.

The CAE Members had the opportunity to describe the main findings of the study conducted by G. P. Wild International Consulting: the itineraries offered by Cruise Atlantic Europe offer to the cruise companies a significant saving in fuel cost, due to the short steaming distances and options for slow steaming between the seven ports with low average speeds.

The CAE itinerary also embraces up to ten world heritage sites in such varied locations as Canterbury, the Mont St Michel near St. Malo, Santiago de Compostela and the Way of St James, the Douro Valley, the Porto City Center, Sintra and Évora.
